The Regional Seminar was inaugurated by Shri. Ravishankar P, Assistant Regional Transport Officer, DK District. Over 750 students participated in the entire deliberation and the students expressed happiness as it was the first time they were exposed to such a programme on road safety and that to coinciding with International Day of Happiness.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Edmond Fernandes, CEO, CHD Group highlighted the fact that over 400 people die on India's roads everyday and who knows who's next.
