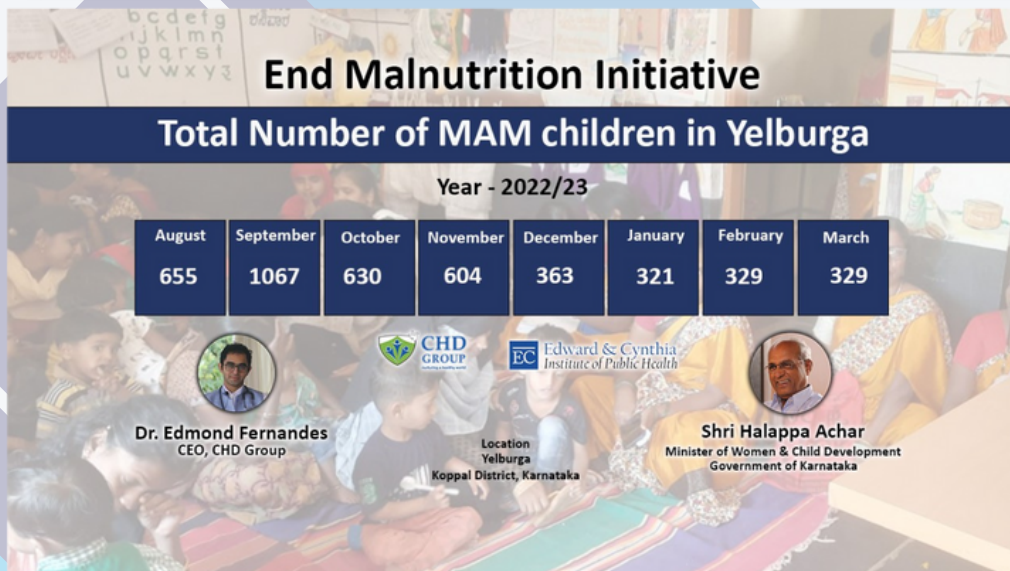
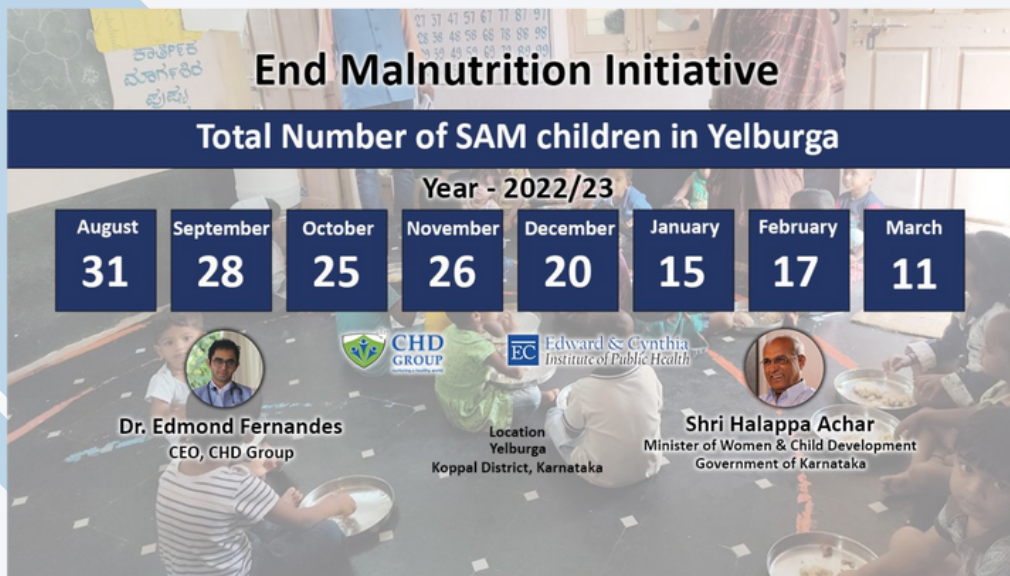




# END MALNUTRITION INITIATIVE

Recommendation : Daily feed the child with this laddoo and monitor weight gain.

### Paushtik Laddoo

#### Ingredients

- Suji 100 g.
- Besan 50 g.
- Gingelly seeds (til) 25 g.
- Milk 250 g.
- Fat/Oil 150 g.
- Jaggery 200 g.
- Elaichi 10gm

#### Method of preparation

- Roast gingelly seed on slow flame till light brown.
- Grind it.
- Heat fat/oil. Add suji and besan and fry till golden brown.
- Mix milk, gingelly seed, and jaggery and remove from fire.
- Allow it to cool and prepare equal size laddoos.

Protein 4.52 g. Iron 1.62 mg. Carotene 163.68 µg.

### Paushtik Burfee

#### Ingredients

- Wheat flour 100 g.
- Besan 50 g.
- Groundnut 25 g.
- Jaggery 150 g.
- Fat/Oil 100 g

#### Method of preparation

- Roast groundnut kernels, remove skin and grind.
- Heat fat/oil, add wheat flour and besan. Fry till golden brown.
- Add groundnut powder and jaggery.
- Mix well and remove from fire.
- Spread on greased plate and cut into equal pieces.

Nutritive values per 100 gms : Calories 503, Protein 6.85 g., Iron 2.84 mg., Carotene 12.50 µg.

Dear Dr. Edmond Fernandes,

I would like to express our gratitude and admiration for initiating the End Malnutrition Initiative (EMI) program at Yelburga Taluk of Koppal District in Karnataka. The community centered effort along with the hand-holding guidance provided to Anganwadi workers & parents of under-five children have enabled change. From 31 children with Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) in August 2022, we now have only 11 children with SAM as on March 2023.

Likewise from 655 children with Moderate Acute Malnutrition (MAM) in August 2022 and 1067 MAM children in September 2022, we now have 329 children with MAM in March, 2023.

This shows that some of the interventions that you have carried out as mentioned below have demonstrated proof of concept and have the potential to scale anywhere in the country.

1. Parents being taught preparation of low-cost energy rich diet
2. Parents engaging in daily recording of weight gain and weekly recording of height gain.
3. Anganwadi teachers engaged in weekly weight and height recording of the child.
4. Refresher training for Anganwadi teachers and on ground ad-hoc supervision during screening of children.
5. Sharing of low-cost dietary intervention to every parent in every household with under five children via infographic and videos in local languages
6. Local elders & retired persons supporting and motivating towards nutritional focus

I request you to persuade meaningful donors and philanthropic agencies to help you to expand this vision and scale it up in all parts of India where there is a need. We are working hard to End Malnutrition and some of the initiatives such as Poshan Abhiyan are steps in this direction. I hope you will continue to support our Department of Women and Child Development, Karnataka and also expand your reach to other areas by inviting Corporates under CSR/ International Agencies to support this scientific public health End Malnutrition Initiative.

Mangaluru: A pilot project initiated by a Mangalurean doctor at Yelburga taluk of Koppal district of Karnataka state has demonstrated that Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) and Moderate Acute Malnutrition (MAM) can be brought to zero with sustained budgets.

The End Malnutrition Initiative, introduced by the Edward & Cynthia Institute of Public Health (ECIPH), a unit of the Center for Health and Development (CHD) group, is a novel public health concept to reduce the burden of malnutrition.

This project was implemented by the CHD Group team and supported by the state's department of women and child development. Dr Edmond Fernandes, director, ECIPH, said due to paucity of funds, the project was implemented in pilot mode to demonstrate 'proof of concept' which it successfully delivered. From 31 SAM children in August 2022, the number came down to 11 in March 2023. Likewise, from 1,057 MAM children in September 2022, the number came down to 329 in March 2023.

Parents of children under five years, anganwadi supervisors, community elders, elected representatives, faith-based leaders were engaged and hand-holding parents towards preparation of food was the main turning point in achieving the success.






